both platforms and Zelda-style overhead sections to contend with, not to mention the hordes of Koopa Troopas coming at him from all angles!



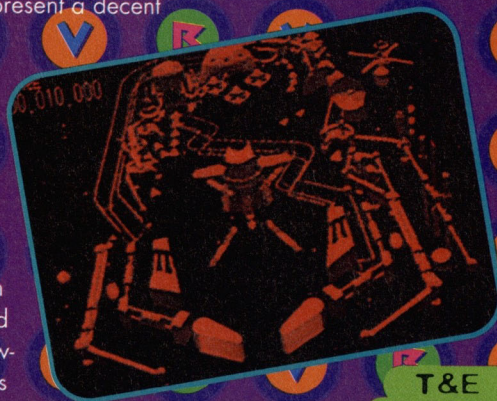
MARIO'S DREAM TENNIS

GALACTIC PINBALL

The Virtual Boy is the machine most likely to be able to present a decent pinball sim, something that has eluded most consoles so far. There are five tables which scroll up and down, following the ball's movement, and there are several layers of depth to the tables.



RED ALARM

A 3D space shooter from T&E Soft that at first glance resembles a wire frame version of Starwing, although the impression of depth and movement are much more pronounced.



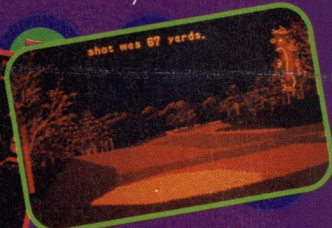
VERTICAL FORCE

The Japanese love baseball, so it's no surprise that one of the first games for the Virtual Boy





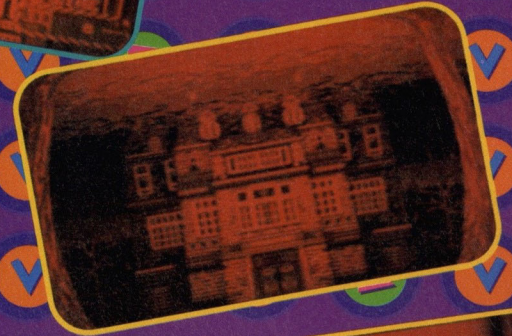
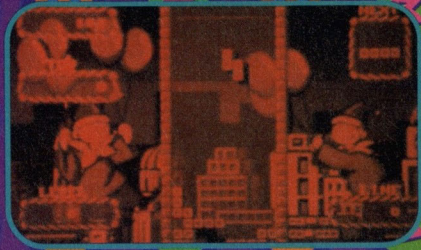
VIRTUAL TETRIS
